RE: National Child Measurement Programme (Reception-aged children)

Your child is invited to participate in the National Child Measurement Programme (NCMP) offered by Kent Community Health NHS Foundation Trust.

National Child Measurement Programme (NCMP)

Each year in England, school children in Reception have their height and weight measured at school as part of the NCMP. Height and weight measurements are used to calculate weight status. We collect this information because it builds a picture of how children are growing and helps plan better health and leisure services for families. This data also allows us to offer you further support and advice about your child's weight. We will be visiting schools throughout the academic year from September 2024 to August 2025.

Measurements are completed by trained healthcare professionals. Children are measured fully clothed, except for their coats and shoes, in a private space away from other pupils.

Your child won't have to take part on the day if they don't want to or are unable to do so. We will contact you to let you know if this happens. None of their measurements are shared with your child's school or any other agencies. You can also be reassured they will not be discussed with your child.

The results are sent to you, so the decision whether to talk to your child about them is entirely yours. If you don't want your child to take part in the NCMP, you can opt them out of the programme using our online form Year R Opt out Form or phoning 0300 123 5205, option two by Friday 20th September 2024. You will need to provide us with your child's name, address, date of birth, school name and address for us to remove them from the programme.
