## 2024 Autumn Term Curriculum Letter for Palmer Class

Welcome to the Autumn Term at Shoreham Village School.

We hope you have all had a restful holiday and are looking forward to a new school year.

We hope that all children have a smooth transition into their new year groups. To help facilitate this, please ensure that your child comes into school on time and has everything they need to learn. Your child will need a named water bottle, we are a healthy school so only water is permitted in their water bottles. It would be helpful if their jumpers, hats etc are named as well. Fruit is provided free of charge for all pupils, however if children bring their own snack please could you ensure that it is a healthy one.

Reading with your child every day for around 10-20 minutes would be hugely beneficial for their learning, moving into KS1. Reading records will be checked daily, as they also provide a valuable link between home and school. When a child has read 100 times with accompanying signatures, they will be awarded a book of their choice.

Homework will be set on the school website on Palmer class page each Friday and homework books will be collected in on a Wednesday. All homework is online and there is no expectation to print anything. Children can answer questions into their homework book. Spellings will also be on the class page on a Friday and tested on the following Friday. Children can choose to practice mild or spicy words. At the front of your child's homework book are a list of common exception words, it would be helpful if your child could be practicing these. It may not always be possible for your child to complete all of the homework set, but please encourage your child to finish what they are capable of, and then spend some time reading for 10 to 20 minutes each day. It is important that the children get into a routine of reading instructions and questions for themselves and to have a good attempt at the work set. A relaxed discussion with your child about work that they are stuck on can often be beneficial, providing your child does not feel under pressure. Please continue to use our Matheletics and Purple Mash program at home as well, logins will be stuck into the reading records.

PE will be on a Monday and Friday afternoon. Please ensure that your child is wearing their PE kit into school, which they will then wear throughout the day.
